SPEAKER'S EVENT - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Due to current Covid protocols for events, and to ensure the safety of attendees, Kay Meek Arts Centre and our Probus Club have the following **MANDATORY** requirements for attendees:

- All attendees must provide a Proof of Vaccination and photo ID at entry to the Centre. If an attendee does not have the Proof of Vaccination, they will be denied entry.
- All attendees must wear a mask on entering and exiting the Centre and remain wearing the mask during the event.
- All attendees must have pre-registered for the event and received a pre-assigned seat.
- Non-member guests are not being invited to attend at the present time.

If you are not feeling well or have any COVID symptoms, we ask for the safety of other members, and the staff and volunteers at the Kay Meek Theatre that you do not attend.

HOW TO REGISTER


Go to the registration link on the front page BOOK YOUR SEAT, which will take you to the Kay Meek Arts Centre box office site for our event. You will then be able to select your seat from the seating chart. You have 2 choices in how to get your ticket – you can have the ticket sent to you to either print at home or have electronically on your smart phone **OR** choose to pick the ticket up at **WILL CALL** at the Kay Meek box office in the lobby level the day of the event. This process is the same as if you were buying a concert ticket, though as a PROBUS member there is no charge for the event. Ticket/Seat reservation booking will CLOSE on Sunday 19 December at 8:00 pm. Please book your seat right away.

If you are having difficulty registering, complete instructions and booking options can be found on our website www.wprobusnsvan.com under Members Information/Kay Meek Box Office Registration Info. On-line booking for seating is preferred so as not to overload the Kay Meek Box Office. However, if you are unable to book on line, you can phone **Kay Meek Box Office at 604-981-6335, Monday to Thursday 1-4pm.**

PARKING - Kay Meek Arts Centre, 1700 Mathers Ave, West Vancouver (west of 15th Street)
There are 3 handicap parking spots on Mathers Ave in front of the Centre and a drop off area.
Mathers Ave Kay Meek entry has elevator access to the theatre lobby level. There is no other parking along Mathers near the Centre. PLEASE DO NOT PARK in the West Vancouver Secondary School lot west of the school, this is reserved for the teachers and students during school hours.

There is lots of parking at the back of the Kay Meek Centre, south side. To access parking, turn west off 15th Street onto Inglewood Avenue, and turn north at a lane behind the Centre. There is a large flat parking area, marked for Kay Meek parking on the left, below the running track, that has plenty of room. There are several handicap parking spots closer to the theatre at the back and regular parking spots as well. Members are asked to preserve the upper parking spots for more mobility challenged members. From this south parking area, there are stairs up to the Kay Meek Arts Centre.

REMEMBER TO WEAR YOUR NAME BADGE – New members can pick up their name badge at the front entrance PROBUS Club desk

There are two entrances to the Centre, one from Mathers Avenue which has elevator access to the theatre lobby level, and a side entrance at the theatre lobby level. WILL CALL members can pick up their tickets at the Box Office on the lobby theatre level. Members should have their electronic or printed tickets with pre-selected seating ready for scanning as well as their **Proof of Vaccination and photo ID.** Upon entry, please proceed directly to your reserved seats to avoid congestion in the lobby area. Due to Covid restrictions, there will be no refreshments served. Volunteers are available to assist with seating. No drinks (other than water) or food are allowed in the theatre.

PROGRAM summary of November Meeting Captain Kevin Obermeyer, CEO Pacific Pilotage Authority

Monday 15 November 2021 will be remembered for the atmospheric river of rain that drowned British Columbia and caused such devastating flooding, mudslides and damage to the province. Our speaker's journey from home was severely hampered by the weather but he arrived safely and provided a fascinating and informative talk on the role and mission of the Pacific pilots who are responsible for the safe handling of most large vessels, and all cruise ships and tankers on the Pacific Coast. Many of our members also braved the drenching rain to come and hear Captain Obermeyer and they were not disappointed.

Capt. Obermeyer outlined the history of pilotage which goes back to 350 BCE to Pytheas and his voyage, and he set out the various significant laws which have guided pilotage through the centuries. Pilots on the west coast are subject to very rigorous training and testing, and the world-wide community of pilots use several training facilities around the world including a new simulation facility here in Canada.

The highly experienced pilots of the Pacific region of the authority take conduct of vessels in any of the coastal waters of the west coast, including the Salish Sea and all the waters around Vancouver Island and Haida Gwaii, and bring them safely to their moorage and conduct them away to sea when they depart. There are an average of 12,500 pilotage assignments every year; Capt. Obermeyer mentioned that there had been no major incidents involving tankers while under pilotage on the west coast, while there have been an average of 5 non-tanker incidents per year (successful pilotages = 99.96%).

Margaret Landstrom officiated at this very interesting speaker meeting.
