# Final Speaker session of the Season – 20 June, 2022

The weather held, and members enjoyed coffee and goodies on the patio level of Kay Meek prior to the AGM and the speakers' presentations. Thanks to our House committee group, Fran Hodgkins and Joanne Pugh and other members who helped out.

Our guest speaker was **John Pyrik** who made a very interesting presentation about Affinity Fraud: "Investor Beware!" - Affinity fraud occurs when the fraudster claims something in common with the victim to lower their guard. Many people, from all walks of life, are defrauded this way. He emphasised that once fraud has happened, there is very little chance of getting the money back, so the best advice is to exercise a high level of caution to prevent any fraud.

With affinity fraud, fraudsters try to get to know people and develop a connection with people. As a result potential victims may be less cautious, unlikely to ask tough questions and hesitate to confirm what the fraudster tells them.

Members of faith groups are particularly vulnerable because they are part of an inherently cohesive and trusting group. Sometimes a scammer will pretend that there is a benefit which aligns with the faith groups' values (supporting orphans), and interestingly, victims are reluctant to testify against the fraudster for fear of embarrassing the faith group.

**West Vancouver Police Service – Sgt. Mark McLean,** Supervisor, Community Services spoke after John Pyrik. Mark talked initially about his own background and experience which illustrated that most local police officers are involved in physical crimes or traffic work, and don't have a lot of experience in fraud, which requires expertise in forensic accounting. There is a Fraud Squad with the RCMP Surrey Detachment with this expertise but they usually work only with large amount frauds (+\$800,000). On the smaller frauds not much is done from the police stand point.

Mark outlined that the most common frauds which target seniors are: Identity theft, Email scams, Telephone scams, Door-to-Door, Grandparent and Romance Scams.

Scams will almost always be high pressure and urgent. He noted one particular phone scam where a scammer will call and give a number where the victim can call back, but when the victim calls back the original call hasn't been disconnected, so the victim is still connected with the scammer. In cases where a number to call back is given, he recommended using a separate phone (cell) to call, or wait a couple of hours and the scammer will probably have hung up by then.

His major suggestions for how to protect oneself:

- Keep all personal documents in a secure place; don't need to carry birth certificate, passport or SIN card
- Never tell another person your PIN and take care when using bank machines and store purchase
- Safely dispose of old bills and statements shredding is best
- Do not click on pop-up windows or respond to emails, open attachments or go to Website links sent by people you don't know. Banks will not send anything by email unless you ask them
- For car insurance information left in the car, have a photocopy with the address blacked out so if stolen thief does not get your address. Keep original at home.
- Ask for proof of identity of persons coming to work in your home, and check references.
- Be suspicious if someone asks you to send money, or a cheque or buy a gift card and send it to them.
